SAFETY PROTOCOLS: ARRIVAL & DISMISSAL PROCEDURES

When students enter the building, they will do so as follows:

- Grades 5-8 and all yellow bus students will enter using the MAIN ENTRANCE DOORS on Suffolk Street
- Grades 9-12 students will enter using the AUDITORIUM ENTRANCE on Oakmont Street

All students will be expected to:

- 1. Complete the daily screener prior to arrival QR CODE →
- 2. Receive a temperature check prior to entering the building using the thermal scanner
- 3. Wear a mask at all times



Students experiencing symptoms related to COVID-19 are expected to stay home for the day and seek the advice of a healthcare professional prior to reporting to school. It is imperative that everyone keeps health and safety at the forefront.

HOMEROOMS OPEN AT 7:55 A.M. ALL STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED TO BE IN HOMEROOM BY 8:00 A.M.

Students will be dismissed as follows:

- Grade 5 & 6 students will be escorted based on their specific dismissal information, as provided to the District and school:
 - Yellow busing students to the bus
 - Students on larger buses will be using the Main Entrance doors
 - Students on smaller buses will be using the Hempstead doors near Suffolk St.
 - o Students being picked up to the Middle School Cafeteria
 - A parent/guardian is to report to the MS Cafeteria doors to sign out their child using a QR code.
 - o Walkers to the Hempstead Ave. exit doors
- Grade 7 & 8 students will be dismissed from period 11 based on the information provided to the District and school:
 - Yellow busing students to their bus
 - Students on larger buses will be using the Main Entrance doors
 - Students on smaller buses will be using the Hempstead doors near Suffolk St.
 - o Students being picked up to the Middle School Cafeteria
 - A parent/guardian is to report to the MS Cafeteria doors to sign out their child using a QR code.
 - o Walkers to the Hempstead Ave. parking lot exit doors
- Grade 9-12 students will be dismissed at the bell based on their mode of transportation:
 - o Yellow busing students to their bus using the Hempstead doors near Suffolk St.
 - o NFTA busing students to their bus using the Oakmont St. doors near Suffolk St.
 - NFTA SPECIALS #12, 19 (S. Buffalo) and 23 will be available on the Oakmont St. side every day. *Please do not block the side street for buses!*

Students being picked up to the HS cafeteria to wait for their parent/guardian to arrive. Walkers to the Oakmont St. doors near Suffolk St.

Any student staying for a club/sport is to report to their designated area, as per their Advisor/Coach, by 3:00 p.m.

CARPOOLING?? Please be sure to add whomever is picking up your child to your student information sheet. Individuals not on Infinite Campus, will not be able to pick your child up.



SAFETY PROTOCOLS: COVID-19 PROCEDURES

Students were given at-home test kits. Here is additional guidance on what you must do based on different scenarios:

What to do once you receive your child's At-Home COVID-19 test results Buffalo Public Schools

AT-HOME TEST RESULTS WERE POSITIVE

Call your child's school and report their isolation status. Then use <u>THIS FORM</u> to report your at-home test results to the Erie County Department of Health, at http://www.erie.gov/hometestreport

If your child tested positive for COVID-19, stay out of school for 10 days since the onset of symptoms or date of positive test. They must be fever free for 24 hours without fever-reducing medication AND their symptoms must be improving in order to return.

If your child previously tested positive within the last 90 days, and tested positive with the COVID at-home test kit, please follow up with your primary care physician.

AT-HOME TEST RESULTS
NEGATIVE, but child has
symptoms

A symptomatic child may only return to school if they:

- Obtain a negative test result from a laboratory PCR test OR
- Get a medical clearance note with an alternate diagnosis OR
- Quarantine for 10-days If your child tested negative for Covid-19 but is experiencing symptoms, you can schedule a COVID-19 NAAT/PCR test by calling the ECDOH at (716) 858-2929. You can also find other testing resources here:

Reminder that "fully vaccinated" means 2 doses of the Pfizer vaccine for children ages 5-12, and you are fully vaccinated 2 weeks after the second dose.

Fully vaccinated students who are not positive do not need to quarantine. If your children test positive or is in close contact with a positive individual, please stay home and contact their school to report this. Documentation for quarantined individuals can be found on the Erie County website here.

What happens if your child is sent home because they are displaying COVID-19 symptoms?

In order for your child to return, you have one of three options:


- 1. obtain a negative COVID-19 test
 - a. at-home test kit results are not accepted for symptomatic individuals. You MUST have a lab performed PCR or Antigen test
 - b. email your results to Mrs. Dulak, Mrs. Cotto or Nurse Bugman
- 2. obtain a doctor's note with an alternative diagnosis
 - a. email or fax your note to Nurse Bugman
- 3. stay home from school for a minimum of 5 days and symptoms must be improving

<u>Individuals must be improving enough to participate in school</u>, not have rhinorrhea (runny nose) or cough severe enough to make mask wearing difficult or unhygienic. Your child MUST be fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications to return to school. *If your child returns to school and continues to display such symptoms, they will be sent home immediately.*
