





Spectator Policy & Code of Conduct

Buffalo Public Schools welcomes all to attend our athletic contests and has made a commitment to promote good sportsmanship by student-athletes, coaches and spectators. We will remain committed to creating a safe, comfortable and enjoyable sports and entertainment experience for all.

By entering this facility, spectators agree to abide by the following Spectator Policies:

1) All spectators are required to have valid photo ID to enter Buffalo Public School facilities.

2) Prior to entry, all spectators are required to cooperate with any and all safety and security check points (i.e. wanding, visual search, and bag checks).

3) Home team spectators (students, parents, community members, staff) are required to sit in the designated home seating section.

4) Away team spectators (students, parents, community members, staff) are required to sit in the designated away seating section. For indoor sports, away team students are required to be accompanied by a parent or guardian throughout the duration of the contest.

5) Spectators are not permitted in the playing area before, during, or after a contest.

6) Spectators will not be authorized for re-entry after leaving the event.

7) Pets are not permitted into the Buffalo Public School facilities.

Spectator Code of Conduct and General Information:

- Spectators shall respect and obey all referees, game management, and staff working the contest. No insults or personal comments of any kind are to be directed toward anyone.
- Inappropriate language, profanity, racial or sexual language or actions will not be tolerated and will result in immediate ejection from the event.
- No violence or threat of violence will be tolerated before, during, or after the event and will result in immediate ejection from the event.
- Alcohol, tobacco and other drugs are prohibited on school grounds.
- Community members are classified as 19 years or older.

Game officials and school district personnel are authorized to eject spectators from the event. Spectators who are ejected from the contest will not receive a refund nor be allowed to return for the remainder of the school year. Further, for student spectators, violations of the BPS Student Code of Conduct will be enforced.
